Thank you to Frank and everyone who chipped in to help with the large amount of water from the recent rainfall events.

Gave synopsis of letter from DEP regarding the EAP (Emergency Action Plan). We are in the process of revising it to submit to the DEP.

Replacing trash rack and potentially the flapper value in the dam.

Water quality issues specifically at Oakwood: possibly geese/waterfowl legacy septic systems. PA Dept. of Health requires us to take the samples, and they make the decision as to if we have to close the beaches. The lake does not test waterfront properties. We do not know if there is an impact on their properties.

Working on addressing the water problem/drainage at Oakwood Beach. This Spring stone was added and it was regraded. There is still a natural spring where the fire pit is located. They are working on that.

Side roads deteriorated and some water wash out during heavy rain.

1. Security Update

Amy- Approx. 5 different calls to have their home checked, rescued a goose and took it to the Environmental Center, several police responses (police depts. are really working with us), had to go to court for LHC, trespassing, people using emergency personal codes to access the lake, multiple reports of strange people walking around, sat at new stop signs to ensure there were not any incidents, first aid at beaches, helped some eldery residents, speeding cars, atvs, etc., and noise complaints.

Most work of the work-checking docks, boat stickers, land storage, checking pins on docks, Birch Pools, etc. Monitored gates for piggybacking and reviewing video.

Had some issues with Greenwood Lake-they were using LHC property. A lot of parking issues of blocking roadways, parking in cul de-sacs, parking on the roads, etc.

Worked with Maintenance-Trained with Frank for plowing, plowed some snow, helped Frank paint, cut back shrubs, etc.
