Per Steve Daderko, per all our testing last year of the water, water quality was good, and no bacteria from the geese. and also land owners need to contact us if there is geese on their property

Per the Board stated by Ryan B, We want a exact quote on billing with hours and what is done, not a estimate, Marcia will contact Lehigh Valley to request this information

Per Craig T, harassment needs to be done, pyrotechnic guns have been purchased by the club and other members. Frank and maintenance can be contacted if geese our seen.

Diane Stockmal stated she is appreciative of the email sent out to members to volunteer to do harassment, she states something needs to be done now, people are going to get sick and this needs to get under control now
